



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From the Desk of the CEO

There was no Council meeting held in August as there were no agenda items to put forward however a Special Budget Meeting was held on the 29th August to adopt the Municipal Budget for the year ending 30 June 2020. A report detailing the budget content is shown below.


Operating Income/Expenditure

Operating income and expenditure represent the income and expenditure that is incurred on a day to day basis and for the first time in a number of years there is no funding for flood damage road works included in income/expenditure.



The operating income for 2019-2020 is \$3,050,810. It can be seen from the above chart that the Shire's key sources of operating income include the funds received as part of the Economic Services Program (20% or \$622,174) which includes fuel sales and caravan park income and funds received as part of the General Purpose Program (71% or \$2,162,813).

The General Purpose Program income includes \$975,882 from rates raised and \$1,025,481 from Financial Assistance Grants, which is Commonwealth Grants Commission funding. 50% of Financial Assistance Grants for 2019-2020 were received in advance and were included as income for the 2018-2019 year so are not included in the 2019-2020 budget.



The Shire’s operating expenditure will be \$4,456,240. The key areas of expenditure are the Transport Program of road works (43% or \$1,929,742), Economic Services (23% or \$1,006,052) which includes fuel purchases for resale and tourism operation expenditure including the caravan park, Recreation and Culture Program (14% or \$640,017) which includes maintenance and depreciation of the water park, Hall, Rec Centre and parks, and the staff Housing Program (5% or \$221,702). The cost of the Governance Program Council support is (4% or \$120,441).

Capital Income/Expenditure

Capital Income

Capital income totals \$1,263,333 with \$220,333 from Main Roads Regional Road Group project grant and \$300,000 from Commonwealth Roads to Recovery grant plus \$743,000 from the Shire’s Plant Replacement reserve.

Capital Expenditure

Capital expenditure is expected to be \$2,385,969 including \$1,157,244 for the Transport Program (Road Works), \$743,000 for net Plant Replacement, \$60,000 for the new Heritage Park, \$30,000 for painting the outside and new blinds for the hall, \$50,000 for the Economic Services Program (Improvements at the Old School Site), and \$6,000 for Community Amenities (Improving the signage at the Cemetery).

WOULD YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO IF YOU SUSPECT YOU OR A LOVED ONE WAS HAVING A HEART ATTACK OR STROKE?

If you experience **any** chest pain, don't just assume that it is nothing and it will go away. It may not.

Don't delay seeking help. .

Call 000.

They are the best people to communicate with RFDS and the Meekatharra Hospital to avoid any delay in your treatment. The Ambulance service has medication that can help alleviate the symptoms, as well as a defibrillator if required.

If you have Aspirin, and are not allergic, chew and swallow 1 tablet immediately while waiting for the ambulance to arrive. Don't use water to wash your mouth out. Try to stay still and calm.

Stroke

With a stroke, time is of the essence. Symptoms such as altered speech, drooping of the face or loss of movement down one side of the body **MAY** indicate a stroke.

Don't delay seeking help.

Call 000

The Ambulance assessment of your symptoms will determine how to treat a possible stroke and arrange the quickest transport to a medical facility.

The sooner you receive treatment the better your chances of recovery with minimal long lasting effects.

If in the event that a crew is not available 000 can advise on what action you can take while they arrange for help.



Pensioner Free Travel - FAQs

- 1 I have a Pensioner Concession Card from Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take one free return or two free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

- 2 I have a Gold Health Card from Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

- 3 How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

Complete the [online registration form](#) and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s). Alternatively download and print the [registration form \(PDF\)](#), complete and send to Transwa with photocopies of both sides of your card.

- 4 What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession or health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accept either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession. When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card. You can also screenshot your digital wallet and send us the image with your online registration form.

- 5 Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink

We need your consent to enable the Australian Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your consent by contacting us.

- 6 How do I book my pensioner free travel?

There are a number of ways to book your Pensioner Free Travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

- Book [online](#) (available from late 2019)

- 7 What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

- 8 Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa?

Pensioner Free Travel - FAQs

From 2020 you must be registered with Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper voucher.

9 Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?

In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim a 50% concession on all Transwa services.

10 Am I entitled to other travel entitlements if I live in the north of Western Australia?

If you live north of the 26th parallel in Western Australia and hold a Pensioner Concession Card or DVA Gold Health Card you may be entitled to other free travel options. Visit the [Department of Transport](#) for more details.

11 Do I need travel insurance?

Travel involves many risks and our liability to you may be limited in certain circumstances. Your WA Pension Free Travel is going digital

From January 2020, Transwa will maintain digital Pensioner Free Travel entitlements for registered WA concession cardholders. Centrelink and the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) will no longer send you WA Free Trip Vouchers with your new concession card.

NOTE: This is the opinion of a recovery towing company who witness and assist at many caravan accidents.

CARAVAN CRASHES - Our opinion why

We have been asked countless times why we seem to attend so many caravan crashes and each time what caused them. There are always thousands of different opinions but we are going to step out and explain some major points we think contribute to these incidents. This may cause a stir with the "experts" and contradict some online information; as we all know just because it is on google doesn't mean it is right. We will stress though this is our opinion, we are not engineers, nor do we have special tickets (other than semi-trailer licences), so take it as you like. This opinion is by a group of us who, outside of work, all travel with large vans and have also attended hundreds of caravan crashes at work. With each crash, as we have interest in caravanning, we look at what we think caused it and often chat to the drivers about their experiences, what they did, look how they set their van up, how different vans are manufactured. Often we see and hear similar problems. We never wanted to express our opinion online of what we thought caused individual accidents, as in some cases manufacturer and aftermarket suppliers may be inclined to sue us for those opinions. Basically this post is not about one particular caravan crash, it is an overview.

Vehicle size and capacity. A vehicle loaded correctly of a decent size is safer than a vehicle that has a bit of paper saying it can. A large 4wd wagon is a fair lump of a car but a lot of these lighter utes out there have a higher towing capacity. Just because it says on paper it can tow 3.5 tonne it doesn't mean you're going to be all good to tow even a 2.5 tonne van. For example a standard Toyota Prado weighs 2.22 tonne and can legally tow 2.5 tonnes but a standard D Max ute weighs just under 2 tonne but can "legally" tow 3.5 tonne. Main point is to ensure if you are using a ute to tow a large van, it needs to have a decent load in it, and we don't mean a couple of fold up chairs and tables. Utes also have longer overhang compared to a wagon so when they start to get the wobbles up it's like a counter lever, it's going to push your backside around a lot easier. Of course large 4wds crash, but we generally see them with larger vans behind. There is no doubt the heavier towing vehicle is, the better. Legally we still say half of the 4wd caravan combinations we see out there would be over loaded, especially over their gvm and gcm weight, but that's a whole new subject we could write a book about.

Caravan weights. This is big one. You need to aim to have around 200 to 250 kgs weight on your tow ball with bigger vans. 10 percent of the caravan weight is a good rule of thumb for whatever size van you tow. Of course you need to have the rear of your tow vehicle set up for this load, and ensure it is legal. If you have no or limited downwards weight from the van going onto the tow hitch of your tow vehicle you're really asking for trouble. Some vans are manufactured with nearly no tow ball weight, some are really scary, do your homework before you make your investment. Some actually work on the front tunnel being loaded with gear and water tanks being full. In some cases a empty or light loaded van ends up being more dangerous. It is really important to check where your water tanks are and understand as they get emptier the towball weight is changing. If you have two full water tanks in front of the axle, they can make a great difference to tow ball weight. But if you have one tank at the front and one at the rear it can act as another risky counter lever if you have the front empty and back full. Also some vans have waste water holding tanks at the back, so you could have camped and unknowingly just moved a 100 plus kgs of weight from your front drinking water tanks and put it in the rear waste tank. This causes a see saw effect and could change your towball weight, to nothing, or even place a lift effect on the rear of the tow vehicle. Buy yourself a tow ball weight scale (about \$70), and check your weight, take note of where your items are in the van and what your water levels are sitting at. Learn how your van works at different times, some people will be shocked. Lots of caravans we collect after accidents (when they stay together) we do see evenly balanced with the tow bar up in the air, or able to pick the drawbar up with one hand. This is a recipe for disaster and we consider the biggest factor for a lot of crashes we attend. Toy haulers that cart motorbikes etc in the back (yes we get them crashed) you really have to think a bit more about what you are doing.

A common comment we often hear and is actually in a lot of training manuals is, if you get the wobbles, speed up and it will pull out of it. We really have to pull this statement apart. Over three quarters of the people we rescue say, it got the wobbles, I gently accelerated to get out of it, and it all got worse quickly. Generally people get the wobbles up when they are going a bit quicker than their combination can handle and often slightly downhill (will cover this soon) so going faster in these situations will only make things worse. An exception would be if you are positive that you can lock your trailer brakes up via your trailer controller, acceleration "may" only then help. We still think the better emergency option is to press your emergency electric brake button or slightly press your brakes so the trailer electric brakes activate, as going faster in these scenarios often doesn't go well.

Electric brake controllers. When you're on the highway turn them up high to provide solid braking to the trailer, if you need to emergency stop you want the trailer to be pulling up faster. If you go through town and turn them down due to brakes locking up at the lights, don't forget to turn them up or they won't be there when needed. The older style controllers had a large solid lever you could grab the slide button to lock the trailer brakes on. The new controllers have a push button, critical thing is the button on lots of models only activate the brakes to what you have them set on. If you have the brakes turned down from in town, the button won't help if a emergency occurs. Lots of vans now have automatic emergency electronic stability control, these are great if operating correctly but make sure you don't fall into a false sense of security, they are only one piece of the puzzle that may help. We have seen people go into emergency situations where they depended on the emergency stability control to help, and appeared it didn't. They run out of time to go back to the manual method of pressing button on brake controller, or slightly touching brakes, to activate the trailer brakes. It also needs to be mentioned trailer brakes of any type needs to be regularly checked, no matter what type you have fitted. If they aren't operating correctly you have an issue. It only takes a simple wire off to stop the process. A good tip too is when you have a brake controller fitted to your vehicle, ensure it is in a very easy to access position while driving, it could be your lifeline.

Anti Sway bars and weight distribution hitches, another touchy subject. First off they are two totally different things but people appear to get them mixed up. Sway bars are designed to help with swaying, weight distribution hitches take weight off the tow ball, and level your vehicle. Most caravan crashes we attend we see weight distribution hitches fitted. With a heavily loaded tow ball they can help. If you have low tow ball weight, we personally consider weight distribution hitches make things worse. With their tension they really could provide the opposite result and have a dangerous lifting effect on the rear of your vehicle. If you are getting any of these accessories, make sure you know what you are doing, know your weights or go to reputable companies who can give you the time to assist in having the right ones. These should not be used as a solution to a problem, only another tool that may help your towing experience. Big point though is if you have lower tow ball weight, or even correct tow ball weight, we consider if you want to have a back up safety feature check you have "Anti Sway Bars" not a "Weight Distribution" system.

Why are there so many accidents in our area? Big factor we see is that we have sections of highway that are downhill, with slight bends, 110 kmh zones, with some cross winds involved. As it is downhill people's speeds unknowingly come up in these sections a bit higher than they normally travel. The extra speed, downhill, winds, plus one or more of the above things discussed can lead to disaster. In real terms with the number of caravans on the road there are no more crashes than other vehicles, but the mess / disruption as well as stress they cause as they are often people's homes puts them in the lime light. We do tend to see every accident has at least two of the above factors involved.

As we said to start with, this is personal opinion. In the end if we share our real life experiences and even if we can help prevent even one accident with our fellow caravanners our job is done.

HISTORY CORNER— An excerpt from the book

Footraces

Sports meetings were held in Nungarra as early as 1904, when the AWA held a sports meeting on Saturday 19 November, although the turnout was reported to be only moderate.

New Year's Day was always a holiday and a day of sport, in spite of the usually hot weather. On New Year's Day 1907, the Black Range Annual Sports Day was held near the Wanderie Mine. Over 400 people were present, with the races having prize money very similar to similar length horse races. For instance, the half mile sprint had a prize purse of £9 and the 1 mile cycle race a trophy worth £10 10s plus £5 cash. A footrace held on the same day had first-prize money of £5. Considering that the highest weekly wage a miner could get at that time was about £5, these were princely sums.

Quite frequently, scratch race were held between individuals, often to settle an argument or just to 'prove' themselves. One such competition held between F. Puddy and G. Evans was run on 8 March 1908 for a prize of £15. The rivals ran three races against each other. Puddy won the first race and Evans the next two.

Following the completion of the new recreation grounds, footraces were held there in April 1908, and the Sandstone Athletic Club was formed at the same time.

To celebrate Eight Hour Day holiday on Wednesday 6 May 1908, a sports meeting was held at the Sandstone Recreation Reserve. A new cinder track had been laid, and a new cycle track around the perimeter of the grounds. The events held were: tug of war (three teams), spud bicycle race, Siamese race, breaking the bottle, ladies nail driving race, sack race, barrel race, football drop kick, and ladies', girls' and boys' races. Admission was 1s. Bookies' fees were £2 2s. The day was ended with a concert and followed by a dance in the AWA hall. From then on during those boom years, Eight Hour Day was celebrated on the first Wednesday in May every year with a sports day.

Prospective competitors would train at home, jogging where they would normally walk. Following weeks of 'training', one hopeful runner, Frank Morrison, mark out a measured 100 yards with the speedometer of his 'ute'. With new wife operating a stopwatch and giving the signal to start, he ran his best. They were both very surprised and extremely encouraged that his time was of world standard! Next day, he repeated the race against the watch, with a similar result, only a little better this time. The following day was the big race, a Frank lined up a very confident young man. Much to his surprise, he was soundly beaten by most of the field. The only excuse he could give himself was that the 100 yards he had measured with his old Dodge was not accurate, or maybe it was the watch. He gave up running after that.

Other celebration days were also commemorated by a sports day, with the first Annual St Patrick's Day sports being held in Sandstone in March 1910. Another day to be celebrated in this manner was Empire Day, when a sports day was held on 28 March 1913.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

19 OCTOBER 2019

ENROLLING TO VOTE

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the following in-person Local Government elections on 19 October 2019 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the district of the relevant Local Government.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5.00pm 30 August 2019. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll but meet the eligibility criteria for this Roll, a claim for enrolment can be made to any Divisional Returning Officer of the Australian Electoral Commission in Western Australia. Forms are available from all post office's or the Western Australian Electoral Commission and must be completed and reach a Divisional Returning Officer by 5.00pm Friday 30 August 2019.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in your Local Government area and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote and should make an enrolment application to the Local Government. If you are not on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in a particular Local Government, you may be eligible to enrol to vote if you were on the Local Government's last electoral roll prior to May 1996. Please contact the particular Local Government for details. Owners of land who were on the last roll of the Local Government continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact their particular Local Government to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next 3 months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms

Enrolment claim forms can be obtained from Local Governments or Australian Electoral Commission offices and should be lodged with the particular Chief Executive Officer by 5.00pm Friday 30 August 2019. If you registered for the 2017 elections or since that time you do not need to register.



Recipe



Sweet Potato Meat Loaf

Ingredients

- 1kg lean beef mince
- 1 small brown onion, finely chopped
- 1 garlic clove, crushed
- 1 large carrot, peeled, grated
- 2 tablespoons barbecue sauce
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 1 tablespoon plain flour
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh rosemary leaves
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh oregano leaves
- 200g orange sweet potato, peeled, thinly sliced lengthways
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh tarragon leaves
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh basil leaves
- 1/4 cup tomato sauce
- 125g cherry tomatoes, halved
- 2 tablespoons pine nuts



Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 200°C/180°C fan-forced. Lightly grease a 7cm-deep, 13cm x 24cm (base) loaf pan.

Step 2

Place mince, onion, garlic, carrot, barbecue sauce, egg, flour, rosemary and oregano in a large bowl. Mix to combine. Spoon half the mixture into prepared pan. Using the back of a spoon, press down firmly to level. Arrange half the sweet potato, in a single layer, over mince mixture. Top with tarragon and basil. Arrange remaining sweet potato, in a single layer, over herbs. Spoon remaining mince mixture over sweet potato. Using the back of a spoon, press down firmly to level.

Step 3

Bake for 45 minutes or until meatloaf is browned and comes away from sides of pan. Spread top with tomato sauce. Top with tomatoes and pine nuts. Bake for 15 minutes or until cooked through. Set aside for 10 minutes. Serve.


